3.1 Report from President/CEO; We received a donation of \$500.00 from ACP Painting (here in Maricopa.) Funds were deposited into the MVCC account (Wells Fargo Bank). The donation was a result of a 5K Run on Saturday, 28 May 2022 at Copper Sky Field (also here in Maricopa.) There was also a donation from Wells Fargo Bank for a total of \$500.00 for a grand total of 1000.00 in donations this quarter. The current balance in the MVCC account is \$2065.97. There was a total of 0 patients seen this quarter by Northern Lights Therapy Group. The MVCC pays for a minimum of two therapy sessions for veteran patients who have no insurance and need treatment. Hopefully, we can receive more funding so we can assist more Veterans. The NLT group treats Veteran patients at a discounted rate. **(NO ACTION REQUIRED).**

3.2 Chrystal (Treasurer) has applied for a 1.2 million grant for the MVCC. The grant is through the AK Chin Tribe (12% Ak Chin Grant.) Chrystal and I were thinking that if we are awarded the grant, we can use the funds to purchase a land parcel in the city of Maricopa and build a conference center with adjoining offices. The event room can be rented for various events and the funds can be put back into the MVCC account. What do you all think? If we are awarded the funding, we will of course vote on a location for the center. Chrystal had to take the initiative to suggest building a center to justify the funding amount. We welcome your input. **(NO ACTION REQUIRED).**

3.3 Chrystal and I visited the Joint Healings Operation group home here in Maricopa. The Director gave us a tour of the facility. The JHO is doing a lot of good in the community. The JHO assists Veterans with substance abuse and alcohol issues with obtaining employment and getting well. Perhaps we can assist them in the future by offering treatment to the veterans at the group home. We also visited the Phoenix Trucking Institute (in Phoenix.) The Military Liaison Officer (Abe Mc Cann) gave us a tour of the facility. The PTI trains and certifies Native Americans, Veterans, and Incarcerated people in obtaining Commercial Driver Licenses and assists the drivers in obtaining employment. Although truck driving is a totally different field than Health and Wellness Therapy, the PTI will be added to the MVCC website to also provide an avenue of employment for veterans. **(NO ACTION REQUIRED).**
